NICK'S NEWS

Well, talk about a busy time! Since my last spring newsletter I've been up to my ears in work - and "official Royal duties"! March through to the end of May seems to have been something of a blur - so much so, I must consider getting some new glasses!! Maybe her Majesty the Queen wouldn't find me so attractive in glasses though!!! In March (27-29th) we had another "Fine Tune Events" music festival weekend to focus on, over in Chester this time. To say it was a huge success would be something of an understatement. In conjunction with my Festival business partner, and fellow musician Elizabeth Harrison, we managed to sort out a brilliant hotel, outstanding artists and quite horrible weather! Yes that was the only downside I guess but then with so much stuff happening, which we'd planned purposely, there really wasn't any need to leave the hotel. But then Chester is such an interesting and historic place and many of our guests couldn't hold themselves back from visiting the city on Saturday and Sunday afternoons. Due to our youngest son Josh's continuing health issues, with seizures and severe autism, we were unsure whether another festival venture would be feasible. The on-going problems he appears to keep having are proving very trying and traumatic on our family. However, after much consideration and because James loves attending the weekend festivals too, and the unprecedented demands of our guests to do another - we have relented. Chester "Fine Tune Events" Festival will happen again in April 2016 (8-11th). We have been raising some fabulous funds for "Miracles to Believe in" in recent months. At the Chester festival we collected just under £500 from the raffle, there have been numerous Fan Club donations (as you'll see from page 4), rewarding contributions from my concert appearances around the country - as well as super amounts from our 'Home Events'. We have to keep on with this fundraising though as without it - the charity would fail. This brings me nicely on to Friday, 8th May (the 70th anniversary of V.E. Day) and the investiture of Nicholas Martin B.E.M. Yes, I was successfully "invested" along with three other recipients of the British Empire Medal at Beaumanor Hall, Woodhouse Eves (near Loughborough), Leicestershire. It was a small, private affair with just the medal recipients, their close family members and Lady Jennifer Gretton (the Lord Lieutenant of Leicester), the High Sheriff of Leicester and several deputy Lieutenants. Lady Gretton presented the medals in what was an emotive and moving ceremony, then official photographs were taken in the hall grounds, and to conclude we enjoyed an exquisite buffet. Lady Gretton then had to leave to preside over a V.E. Day Event at County Halls.

It was without doubt a proud and defining day for us all - the presentation of a Royal award for services to charity (and "Miracles to Believe in"). Of course our next engagement is on Thursday 28th May when we visit Buckingham Palace and one of the Queen's famous Garden Parties. Unfortunately this newsletter had to be sent to the printers before the Garden Party so we are unable to report about this until the autumn newsletter.

Because it's half-term week we've managed to get Lou (one of the teacher's from the boys' school) to look after James and Josh on the 28/29th. Lou and her husband Daryl have developed a real rapport with the lads and if or when Marianne and I want an evening away now - we can comfortably ask them to take charge of things for us, and we know they'll be in safe, caring hands. It's a real weight off our minds to have them as friends and carers.

So here's my certificate from her Majesty - proving once and for all that my award is official (that is my actual British Empire Medal resting on the certificate too).

I had some great concert events during the March-May period. In particular I love "getting to grips" with the "Mighty Wurlitzer" theatre organ - something I'll always have a deep-rooted passion for. I even visited a Wurlitzer I hadn't played before in April at the Royalty Cinema, Bowness-in-Windermere (Cumbria). It's a relatively new installation in the cinema, which seems quite strange I know to relate to in the 21st Century. After all they finished installing cinema/theatre organs in the late 1930's. However, it's happened and it's a super little Wurly in the perfect environment. With the heavy tourist trade that takes place up there in Windermere I expect this organ and cinema do to very well in the foreseeable future.

Also in April I played at the Shrewsbury Buttermarket again - where I've concertised numerous times over the years - in fact it was announced as my 25th visit to this venue. Those keen purchasers of my so-called 'recording material' will be fully aware that I've recorded this organ twice already ("live concerts" on DVD). Well my good friend Ray Springthorpe was present that day to record my latest exploits on the Shrewsbury Wurlitzer and so it rests in my little hands as to whether or not I'll release this latest DVD. Because I've done two already I'm in a quandary. So if after you receive this newsletter I start to get begging letters - along the lines of - "please, please release the Shrewsbury DVD" - then I'll give it some fair consideration. Otherwise, on ya bike!+

Our delightful "Teeside friends" Lin and Peter Craddy, who 'managed' so well the "Miracles" raffle at the Chester Festival, sorted out a concert for me at their local church in April - my second visit there. Pete and his pal Ian did a super job of organising this event and it was made all the more special by the fact that Marianne came with me and we stayed over at the Craddy's. It was extremely memorable and a must repeat venture (which we're working on).

I am happily carrying on my dance work for Phil and Delia Groves at Woodhall Spa, where I make two appearances a month playing for both sequence and ballroom. If you're in the vicinity please give one of these a try. You don't have to be a dancer to come along - as we're starting to get quite a gathering of music fans who just come along to listen now. All dates are in my diary of events on page six. They're lovely events and people. In May I visited the Norbreck Castle Hotel in Blackpool - as part of the Keyboard Cavalcade Festival goings-on. I was quite shocked to see such a low turn-out at this event when in the past there has been several hundred folk in attendance. It's the first time I'd visited this venue as they used to meet at Pontin's (which is no more). The hall was a mega-huge convention type building with strange accoustics. Gosh the sound did swim in there! Well, that's a brief resume of some of my happenings. There's more next time - and I hope to see you at some of my other dates in 2015.


